ARRANGEMENTS

The above named subject voluntarily submitted to a polygraph examination administered by Paul Redden at the Calipatria State Correctional Facility, Calipatria, California, where the subject is currently incarcerated.

The examination utilized a Lafayette computerized polygraph instrument which indicated and recorded relative changes in blood pressure, rate and strength of pulse beat, galvanic skin response and breathing pattern.

It was the understanding of the examiner that the primary purpose of this examination was to determine the truthfulness of the subject's statement when he denied any knowledge or personal involvement in the shooting death of DeAnthony Williams who was shot to death on September 9, 1993, near 4812 W. 17th Street, Los Angeles, California, during a drive-by shooting.

The subject stated that he was arrested in October 1993, tried and convicted of the shooting death of DeAnthony Williams and has been serving his prison sentence since then.

He said that he first learned about the shooting on the morning of the incident when he was watching television at his residence. He said he was familiar with the neighborhood where the shooting occurred. At the time he was a member of the "Bloods" gang and the shooting occurred in a rival gang, "Crips" neighborhood and appeared to be in retaliation for a shooting of one of his gang members the previous night. John said that he was not involved in the shooting and did not know for sure who was. He said that he did not own or drive any of the cars that were listed as possible suspect vehicles. Smith denied that he had any

knowledge as to who fired the shots that resulted in the death of DeAnthony Williams and denied that he fired any of the shots that resulted in the Williams' death.

During the course of the four administered polygraph examinations the following relevant questions were asked:

RELEVANT QUESTIONS

1. Did you fire one or more of the shots that resulted in the death of DeAnthony Williams?

SUBJECT answered: "No."

2. Are you in any way involved in the 1993 shooting of DeAnthony Williams ?

SUBJECT answered: "No."

RESULTS

At the conclusion of the polygraph examination a careful evaluation of all the subject's polygraph charts revealed physiological responses generally associated with truthfulness. It is my opinion, as the examiner, based on a careful analysis of all the subject's polygraph charts that the subject was not attempting deception when he answered "no" to the above relevant questions.
